

The Office of Professional Development: 2023 Spring Convocation Survey Results

I. Introduction

This summary provides an overview of the feedback received from faculty and staff who participated in the professional development sessions during spring convocation. The survey results will help us understand the effectiveness of the training sessions offered, and identify areas for improvement in our professional development programs.

The survey was designed to gather feedback on various aspects of the professional development sessions, including the relevance of the topics covered, the quality of the instructors, and the overall satisfaction with the sessions and convocation format. The survey opened on 01/18/2023 and closed on 01/23/2023. A link was emailed to all full-time faculty. The survey responses indicate a high level of positivity, despite the low response rate of only 25 out of 131 requests. Despite the small sample size, the responses are valuable in providing insight into the experiences of the instructors and can be used to inform future convocation sessions. Overall, the results demonstrate that the majority of instructors who participated in the survey had a positive experience and valued the opportunity to come together and share their knowledge and expertise.

II. Overview

The 2023 Spring Convocation Survey aimed to gather feedback from faculty members who attended the event and sessions. Out of the 131 faculty surveyed, 25 provided responses, allowing us to gain insights into the overall satisfaction and areas for improvement for future convocations.

III. Key findings

a. Likert Scale Questions:

The event was generally well-received by the participants, with the majority of respondents agreeing or strongly agreeing that the event was well-organized, the presenters were knowledgeable in the subject matter, the sessions were an appropriate length, and the variety of topics was satisfactory. However, there were also some respondents who disagreed or strongly disagreed with these statements, indicating areas for improvement. Additionally, a slightly lower number of participants strongly agreed that the event length was appropriate and the sessions will improve their skills or courses, suggesting that these areas may also be worth further attention.

b. Open Ended Questions: Regarding the event

The iDesign event was well received by the participants, with a variety of aspects being highlighted as most liked. The information provided to faculty and staff, professional environment and organization, the option to attend online, great timing and scheduling, the opportunity to prep classes, the variety of sessions that included topics like wellness and diversity, the option for in-person or online attendance, the ability to work on other obligations during the day, and the different topics covered were all highly rated. Additionally, the Ed Puzzle session was also well received and the opportunity to interact with faculty from other campuses was appreciated.

The least liked aspect of the event was technical issues, particularly with Zoom and the YouTube link not allowing participants to see the presentation on the Smartboard. Additionally, some participants expressed dissatisfaction with the lack of technical interest/involvement and the fact that some sessions were too long and difficult to pick. Some participants also wished for more time

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to attend all the presentations, and found the schedule emailed was confusing. Others found the insistence that you must Zoom from your home campus to be considered present and people talking over the presenters during the live session as an issue. Some participants also felt some presenters were not 'well-knowledgeable' on the institution's basic information and were disappointed by the repetition of the same speakers. Some also felt that the event could have been condensed to two days or three days to allow for more time to work on their courses.

Overall, the event received positive feedback from the participants with many praising the organization, flow, and the in-person and Zoom option. However, there were also some suggestions for improvement such as recording all presentations, giving faculty more time to prepare for classes, having a joint event with staff, and providing food and snacks at all campuses, not just the Uvalde campus. Some participants also highlighted the need for shorter and more varied sessions, more Q&A and for questions from the audience to be relayed over the mic on the podium for those listening online. Additionally, there were requests to observe strict time limit for presentations and to include more technical interest/involvement.

c. Open Ended Questions: Regarding the sessions

The iDesign and EdPuzzle sessions were the most popular among participants, with many praising their usefulness and the opportunity to learn new skills. The Opening and Diversity sessions were also well-received, as well as the Self-Care and Canvas updates sessions. Additionally, a significant number of responses also highlighted the value of the Faculty Success Activities Lab/EOY Checklist, Course Design, Simple Syllabus, Planning and Self-Study, QM/Measurable, Precise, Consistent and Clear Objectives and class prep time. Overall, the majority of the participants found these sessions to be informative and beneficial.

The majority of the participants found all of the sessions to be informative and beneficial, and there were no specific sessions that were identified as least enjoyable. However, some participants highlighted that they would have liked to attend all the sessions but didn't have availability to do so. Additionally, a small number of participants found the Skills USA presentation to be less enjoyable and/or less useful to them due to the timing and the fact that it wasn't relevant to their department or role. Additionally, some participants found the iDesign sessions to be too many and felt like it was taking over convocation, and others found the self-care and course design sessions to be less helpful.

The majority of the participants would like more hands-on training on specific tools such as iDesign, Watermark, Self-Service and Canvas, while requests for extended training in Universal Design for Learning for online/hybrid instructors and Quality Matters Objective-based assessment design were noted. In addition, requests were made for trainings dealing with emotional intelligence, learning styles, project-based learning, and continuation of sessions dealing with wellness, faculty and staff support, student engagement, student evaluations, writing skills, and new and latest technologies and advances in the teaching field. Additionally, some participants would like to see separate live presenters for each campus to help with training and checklist preparation, and others would like to see sessions on paperwork and documentation changes and updates with specific and detailed timelines.

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V. Action plan

There are several actions that can be taken to address the low survey response rate, event length and to address the concern regarding sessions which did not improve faculty skills or course delivery:

1. **Increase outreach and engagement:** Provide more information about the survey, reach out to more participants by sending follow-up invitations to participate, and make the survey process more convenient and user-friendly by increasing the survey response timeline.
2. **Review event length:** Based on the feedback received, adjust to the timing of the event to better meet the needs of all involved.
3. **Review session content:** Review the content of the sessions to ensure they align with the goals of the participants and that they will improve their skills or courses. Consider incorporating more interactive activities or hands-on training to enhance the participants' learning experience.
4. **Follow-up and evaluation:** Regularly follow-up with the participants through their Division Chairs and evaluate the effectiveness of the sessions to ensure they are achieving the desired outcomes. Use this feedback to make any necessary adjustments to future sessions.
5. **Communicate with the participants:** Communicate with the participants regarding the actions taken based on the feedback received, and how it will improve their experience in the next event.

VI. Conclusion

In conclusion, the Spring convocation survey results provide valuable insight into the experiences of the instructors who participated in the sessions. Despite the low response rate, the results demonstrate a high level of positivity, with the majority of instructors agreeing or strongly agreeing that the event was well-organized and the presenters were knowledgeable in the subject matter. However, the results also indicate areas for improvement, such as the event length and the effectiveness of the sessions in improving skills or courses.

We would like to thank all the faculty who participated in the survey and provided valuable feedback. We believe that this summary will be a valuable tool for the Office of Professional Development as we plan and implement future professional development programs. The feedback will help us continue to provide relevant and high-quality professional development opportunities for our faculty.

We are confident that this summary will provide valuable insights into the professional development needs of our faculty, and will help us to improve the quality of our training programs in the future. We look forward to implementing the feedback and continue to support the professional development of our faculty.

The results and the action plan for improvement will be communicated to all instructors via the Professional Development webpage and any feedback will be followed up. Again, we appreciate

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the time and effort of the instructors who participated in the survey and look forward to continuing to work towards providing a valuable and enriching experience for all instructors.
